

Community Mental Health Association Social Media Toolkit



Background

Senate Majority Leader Mike Shirkey recently introduced two new bills – Senate Bills 597 & 598, which attempt to reboot and expand the failed "Section 298" effort of several years ago. This legislation would privatize all Medicaid mental health services by giving full financial control and oversight to for-profit insurance companies.

The Community Mental Health Association of Michigan (CMHA) launched a public relations campaign in opposition of these bills. Lambert has developed a social media toolkit for CMHA to share with its members to support this effort. The following toolkit includes social media graphics and suggested copy for members to share on their own social media platforms. The posts are written for Facebook, where CMHA currently has social media ads running. However, we encourage each member to edit the copy for other platforms you see fit.

The recommended timeline for posting is February 2022 through April 2022.

Senate Bills 597 & 598 give more power over services to for-profit insurance companies that have limited experience in serving persons with mental health needs. In fact, a recent poll commissioned by the Community Mental Health Association of Michigan and conducted by third-party EPIC MRA showed 76% of Michigan voters are concerned that private, for-profit health plans, do not have a good track record in treating patients with mental health needs and fear they will make matters worse. A new poll commissioned by the Community Mental Health Association of Michigan and conducted by third-party EPIC MRA found that nearly 4 times as many Michiganders are less likely to support their legislator if they support the privatization of mental health services for Medicaid patients. A new poll commissioned by the Community Mental Health Association of Michigan and conducted by third-party EPIC MRA in January 2022 found that 73% of Michigan voters are concerned that high overhead costs of the private health insurance companies (double that of the public system) will lead to less mental health services for those in need.

Controls Costs


We control costs, resulting in billions of dollars of savings for the state's taxpayers when compared to Medicaid cost increases seen in other states.


The study by the Center for Healthcare Innovation and Integration found that Michigan's public mental health system has a long tradition of high performance. Each year more than 325,000 Michiganders receive their services and care from the Michigan public mental health care system.



The National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) gave for-profit, health insurance companies that provide mental health services for treatment of mild-to-moderate mental health cases 2.4 out of 5 stars.

Supporters of the public mental health care system are concerned that health insurance companies will not be able to provide services for adults with severe mental health needs. according to this new poll. Additionally, other states (such as Iowa) who have selected private companies to manage mental health care have found they do not provide the same level of care or understand the unique needs.
